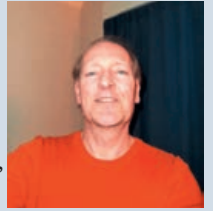
Dear Readers: The Swiss have just voted firmly in favour of a **13th monthly pension payment** as part of the country's old-age and survivors' state pension plan. Currently paid in 12 instalments, the initiative proposed a 13th pension payout per year as of 2026. The surprisingly strong backing by voters was called "historic" and seen by some as a

"protest vote". Specifically *how* the initiative will be funded has yet to be determined. Of note: The Swiss Abroad showed stronger support for the proposal than the general population in Switzerland (65% versus ~ 58%). In the run-up to the vote, critics had argued the Swiss Abroad were "milking the system" – they often reside in countries with a lower cost of living where the Swiss franc has more

purchasing power - and thus shouldn't benefit from an extra payment.

Given the rapidly rising cost of living in Canada, most Swiss here would probably disagree!

Our raclette lunch was held on March 3 in the family room at Rosemarie Eilinger's seniors' residence.

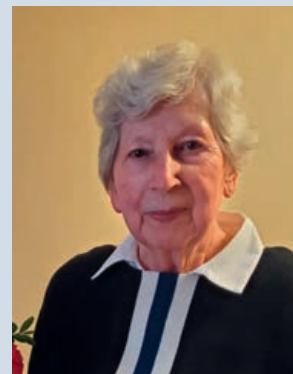

Swiss Heritage in Western Canada - Edelweiss Village in Golden, BC - LATEST DEVELOPMENTS

Quick Historical Recap

In the April 2022 issue, we featured *Edelweiss Village*, a former Swiss colony in Golden, BC, the “home of the famous Swiss guides”. You can read that story here: https://www.swisscommunity.org/fileadmin/revue/Ausgaben/2022/02/SRV-2202_CAN.pdf (see page III).

In an effort to boost tourism and mountaineering in the Canadian Rockies, starting in 1899, the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) began hiring mountain guides exclusively from Switzerland, drawing on their expertise, rock solid reputation, and near flawless safety record.

In order to house these pioneering Swiss guides (who initially “commuted” seasonally between Canada and Switzerland), from 1910 to 1912, the CPR built an ensemble of six picturesque chalets that make up *Edelweiss Village*; this allowed the guides to relocate their families to Golden.

At the time of the 2022 article, the *Village’s* future was uncertain and potentially in jeopardy - the homes had long been sitting empty and were up for sale, possibly slated for demolition.

Shared Announcements

New Owner and Work Performed

In July 2023, Canmore, AB-based **Montayne Capital Corp.** (“Montayne”) — <https://www.montayne.ca> — acquired the *Edelweiss Village* property.

To date, the new owner has made the following improvements to the site and its structures:

- **Site Assessment:** A comprehensive assessment of the site was performed to gain a deeper understanding of its unique characteristics and intricacies;
- **Ground Stability:** Extensive testing and surveys were conducted to confirm the stability of the ground and to ensure the safety of the buildings at their current locations;
- **Fire Smart Measures:** Strategies in line with the BC Fire Smart Manual were implemented to protect the homes and surrounding areas;
- **Renovation Work:** A complete exterior renovation of the buildings was carried out, including fresh paint and roof and deck replacements. The restoration process was approached with sensitivity and with a commitment to preserving and recreating as much of the original building design as possible;
- **Pest Control:** Measures to eliminate rodents and other unwanted visitors were taken, safeguarding the historic site;
- **Site Cleanup:** The site was cleaned up and debris was removed.

Upcoming Commemorative Events

2024 is the 125th anniversary of the CPR first hiring Swiss mountain guides to work in Canada. To mark and celebrate the occasion, commemorative events are being planned for the weekend of **October 4 - 6** at *Edelweiss Village*, and in Golden. Details are not yet available. Future Prospects

In the near-term, Montayne intends to rent out the chalets in order to recoup some of its recent site-related and renovation costs. In regards to its long-term vision for *Edelweiss*, the company has stated that “... it remains a work in progress. We are exploring a variety of ideas to determine the best use of the land”.

The Swiss Edelweiss Village Foundation is working with a heritage specialist to develop a so-called Statement of Significance that would pave the way to attain official **heritage recognition and protection** status for the site. This work is generously supported by a grant-in-aid fund from the Columbia Shuswap Regional District.

Last but not least, both parties are actively collaborating on the vision of creating a **Swiss Guides Great Hall** that would pay homage to the mountain guides that called *Edelweiss* their home, bringing their history to life and celebrating their contributions.

Edmonton Swiss Men's Choir (ESMC)

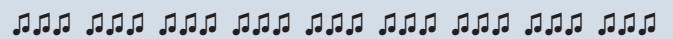
Our 2023 Christmas concert season ended with our popular annual concert at the St. Vital Catholic Church in Beaumont, AB (picture below).
